

#### **Bobbin Lace Classes**

#### Buck, Beds, Lester, Honiton, Hungarian, Russian Saturday, Sunday, Monday

Holly Van Sciver, teacher



Bucks Point, Beds, Lester, Honiton, are English bobbin laces. In addition to those, Holly will teach Hungarian and Russian tape laces and Contemporary lace. So many options! Bucks (geometric or floral) is a continuous bobbin lace

characterized by a delicate ground and a pattern outlined in gimp. Beds, also continuous, has a plaited ground. Honiton is a free lace. The tape laces of Hungary

and Russia offer other skills, as does Contemporary lace. Once you choose which lace you will be working on and indicate whether you are a beginning or continuing

student, Holly will be in touch and send you appropriate patterns.

PREREQUISITE: Beginning students must have good fundamental bobbin lace skills.



# Schneeberger, s'Gravenmoer, Flanders

This class offers some of the laces of the Low Countries: Netherlands, Belgium, Flanders. Schneeberger is a tape lace that can be an edging or a complete motif by itself. s'Gravenmoer lace has some unique stitches and frequently outlines with gimp. Flanders ground is one of the five-hole grounds, using four pair to make a Flanders stitch. Linen motifs are outlined by gimp. Make sure you indicate your skill level and which lace you want to concentrate on. PREREQUISITE: Beginning students must have good fundamental bobbin lace skills.


#### **Beginning Bobbin Lace**

Have you always admired lace and wondered how you could make it? For those with no or limited experience with bobbin lace, this class is for you. Find out how to make this wonderful art form as well as so many of the details that are not necessarily available in a book.

Barbara has excellent lace skills and has taught bobbin lace many times. A kit is available with basic equipment and patterns available for an extra fee of \$35.00. If, at the end of the course, you don't want to continue (or perhaps you won a pillow in the drawing), she will buy it back for the same amount.



### **Tatting Classes**

#### **Tatting, Beginning and Continuing**

Saturday and Sunday

For Saturday afternoon -

Biscornu pincushion – made in one round in size 20 thread, this motif teaches the balanced half-double stitch and tatting on a button... Then it's used to ornament and complete an eight-sided pincushion. Kit (\$5) includes a needle, buttons, wool felt, sewing thread and stuffing. Bring two shuttles.

For Sunday -

A suite of snowflakes - half a dozen new originals to choose from. You know how once it starts snowing, there's



always more snow? Be prepared for the season with decorations, gifts, and new tatting techniques to play with this winter. Techniques to practice with the various snowflakes include Celtic tatting, half-double stitch, block tatting, swirl join, and thrown-off rings. Also tatting over a cabone ring, multi-colored Celtic tatting and floating chains. You will receive all the patterns and will have your choice of the projects you wish to tat in class. Bring two shuttles and the thread size of your choice. Suggestion: put about 90 beads on your thread for each snowflake you plan on tatting (size 10 beads fit on size 10 AND size 20 thread) and wind shuttles in class. Also bring your usual tatting supplies.
